A FAMOUS GLASGOW ROTARIAN- SIR HARRY LAUDER

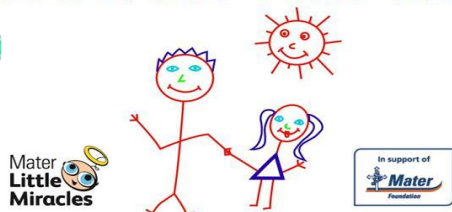
Harry was born in Edinburgh on August 4, 1870, his father being a Master Potter. When Harry's father accepted an excellent position at Pearson's Pottery near Chesterfield in Derbyshire, the family moved there but after only a short time, he contracted pneumonia and died aged only 32. Harry and his mother then moved




back to Scotland to Arbroath with the rest of the family. Throughout the war, the patriotic Lauder worked unceasingly, raising huge sums of money for war charities, both in Britain and in America, entertaining troops in the trenches in France, where he came under enemy fire, as well as helping to raise morale at home with his many appearances. With his natural humour and lively manner, Harry Lauder was also in great demand as a speaker at Rotary Clubs, and visited several clubs in North America during his tours there during the war years. Harry Lauder was knighted in January 1919 by King George V and later Winston Churchill referred to him as "Scotland's greatest ever ambassador". Harry was the first British entertainer to sell a million records and was a favourite of royalty and an intimate friend of the famous tea magnate Sir Thomas Lipton. *SIR HARRY LAUDER was an active member of the Rotary Club of Glasgow.*

Albury Wodonga Mother's Day Classic

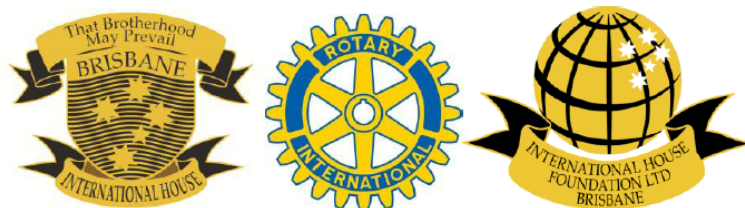

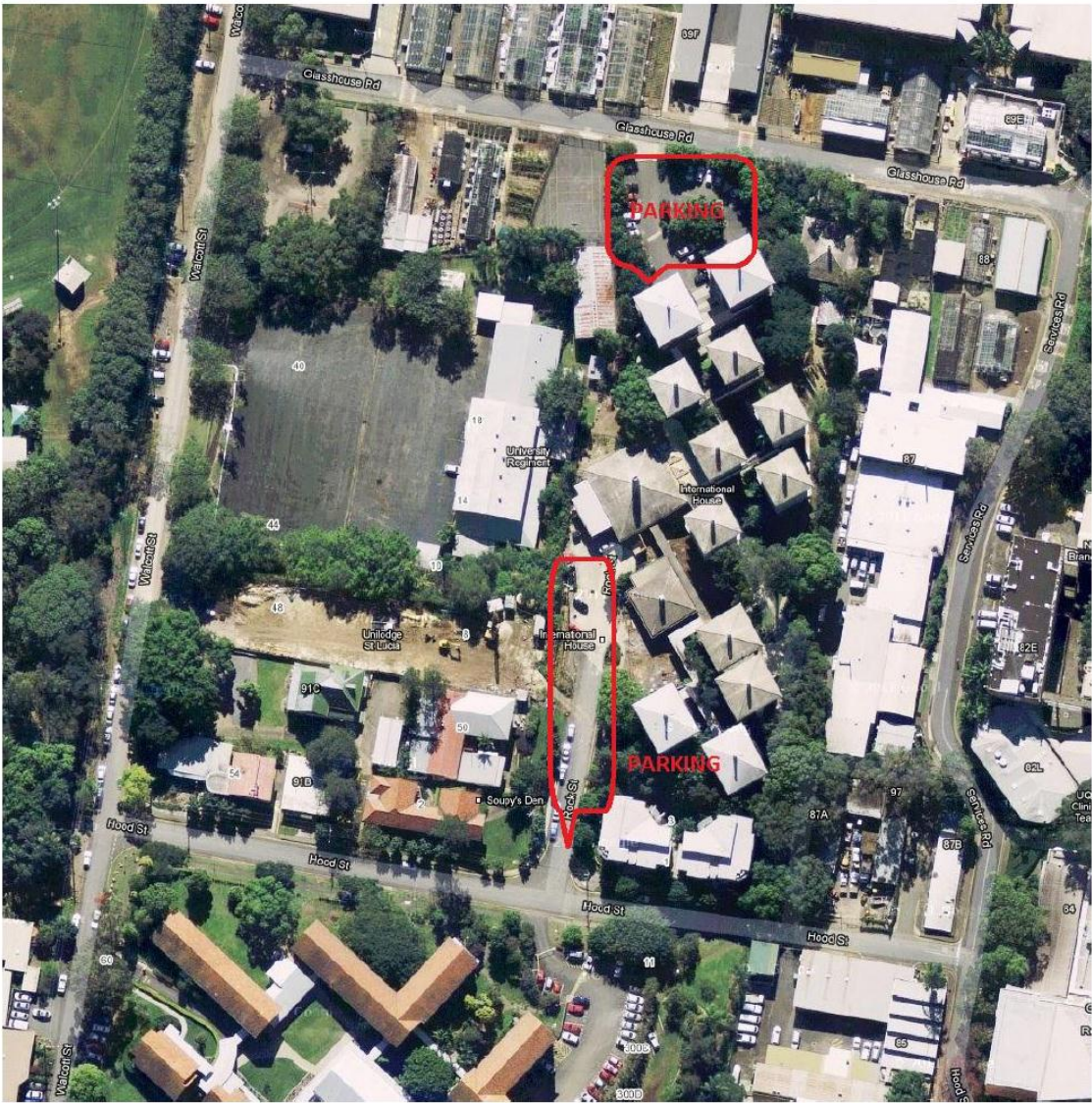

Many of you will have noticed over the past months, that the ways in which we are able to help families affected by disaster has changed. Increasingly, we are no longer offering a 'one size fits all' solution. In responding to the conflict in Syria and the recent Super Typhoon in the Philippines, we recognised that supplying a full ShelterBox is not always the most appropriate use of donor's money. Sometimes 'tents only' may be the solution, Relief Tents, Midi Tents or, in the case of Syria, unbranded, UN-spec, Al Pinter tents. We recognised the need for families in the Philippines, (who had adequate, or near-adequate shelter), for water purification equipment; mosquito nets; tool kits; solar lights and in some cases, tarps to help fix roofs or Shelter Kits to rebuild homes.

This evolution does not mean that we will no longer supply full ShelterBoxes. From the start, box contents have been tailored to suit conditions and needs. Boxes will still be supplied when needed to international locations affected by disaster, and donors who wish to sponsor a box will be able to trace where their box has been sent. Our new, more flexible approach will help us to help more people with appropriate aid, as we have done in the Philippines and continue to do in and around Syria.

Fresh figures in from our Headquarters show that in 2013 ShelterBox responded to 34 disasters in 18 different countries, helping over 10,000 families. All of this was made possible by your generous donations.

As the tax year comes to an end, please consider making another tax-deductible donation to help us help more people.

Rotary's top honor for Fred

KIPPA-RING Rotary Club has conferred a Paul Harris Fellowship on Grace Lutheran College principal Fred Stolz.

The prestigious award was made by club member Lindsay Meyers, himself a Paul Harris Fellow.

It had special significance as it was the first time the club had conferred Rotary's highest honor, named after its founder, on a non-Rotarian.

Mr Stolz joins a select group of more than 120,000 Paul Harris Fellows around the world including Pope John Paul, Mother Teresa, the Duke of Edinburgh, former US President Ronald Reagan and Dr Jonas Salk.

Kippa-Ring Rotary Club president Tony O'Keefe said the award to Mr Stolz recognised his contribution to education in Papua New Guinea and Redcliffe.

Mr Stolz graduated from Sydney University with a science degree in 1955.

He taught in several New South Wales schools, completed a BA degree through external studies from the University of New England in 1963 and was the foundation principal of Balob Teachers' College at Lae in New Guinea during 1965-74.

He became a member of the Australian College of Education in 1969, completed an MA in Education at a Lutheran Teachers' College in Chicago in 1975 and spent four more years at the teachers' college in Papua New Guinea.

In 1980 he came to Redcliffe as headmaster of Grace College.

A member of the Association of Independent Schools of Queensland Education Committee, he is chairman of the Googa Outdoor Education Centre board and the Noosa Lutheran Secondary Schools Task Force.

He is a member of the Lutheran Church

Finance Council and the Board of Teacher Registration.

He was invited to the 25th anniversary celebrations of Balob Teachers' College last September when its administration building was named after him.
