NATIONAL YOUTH SCIENCE FORUM



While their peers spend the holidays preparing for their final year of school, **Emma Godfrey** will join around 400 fellow students from across Australia and the world to sample university life as part of the **2016 National Youth Science Forum**.

The students will be split into 14 Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) fields and will live on campus at Australian National University for two 12-day sessions in January, 2016.

Far from being stuck in a science lab all summer, the program gives them a taste of the diverse study and career options available in STEM, with field trips and exposure outside their area of interest to foster the beginnings of a professional network.

After more than 30 years the summer school-style program, co-founded by Rotary International, had an impressive list of alumni who had gone on to successful careers, from university deputy vice-chancellors to deans of science.

The competitive forum attracts about 1200 applicants each year, with each Rotary district in Australia choosing well-rounded students based on their academic achievements and community involvement, giving equal representation to regional and metropolitan students.

After the January program, the students will meet again at regional cities and a lucky few will have a chance to join the international program.



The **Rotary Club of Taipei** in Taiwan as the first Rotary Club established on the island of Taiwan, with a charter date of October 9, 1948.



One of their service projects includes an English Speech Contest (ESC) which is now in its 60th year of operation.

RECENT DEPLOYMENTS



Syria - Conflict

It has been four years since conflict broke out in Syria. More than **10 million people**, almost half of Syria's population, have been displaced. Around 4 million people have sought refuge in other countries. Shelterbox continues to work with partner agency, **Hand In Hand For Syria (HIHS)** to distribute aid throughout the country including to areas in the Aleppo governorate and the Syrian/Turkish border. Recently, a further **350 UN spec tents** were distributed with the help of the **Violet Organization**.



Cameroon - Conflict

ShelterBox received a request to provide aid in Cameroon to around 45,000 families. Some of these families are refugees from Nigeria, while others have been displaced due to conflict within the country. So far, **224 ShelterBoxes** have been distributed in the refugee camp in Minawao in the Extreme North region of Cameroon by aid agency **International Emergency and Development Aid (IEDA Relief)**.



Nepal - Earthquake

Monsoon season has begun, bringing with it the threat of flash flooding and landslides. It is likely to last for around three months, further compounding the rebuild efforts. The Operations Team is working with the **Agency for Technical Cooperation and Development (ACTED)** to distribute further aid. **14,500 tarpaulins** have been transported into the country and are being distributed along with materials from **ACTED**, such as corrugated iron, so that people can create temporary shelters and make repairs on damaged buildings too. With ongoing financial support, our Foundation will continue to carry on Klumph's dream well into our second century of service.
