Cathy Gear was a RYLA recipient in 1965. She had a great life growing up on a dairy farm at Innisplain in the Scenic Rim. After High School she worked on the farm with her Dad. Cathy moved to Sandgate 46 years ago and as a housewife and Mum first and foremost went on to sell World Book Encyclopedias before joining Cross Country Tours in a voluntary capacity for 3 years, 6mths part time, 17 years full time before her children and she bought the *Business in 2001*. Clarence Birdseye, 1886–1956, American inventor and founder of the frozen food industry, b. Brooklyn, N.Y., studied at Amherst College. From 1910 he worked as a naturalist, and in 1912 he went to Labrador on a fur-trading expedition. After he returned to the United States in

1916, he began experimenting with freezing foods, aiming at commercial application. He developed a method for freezing fish and in 1924 he was one of the founders of the General Seafood Company, which began manufacturing various fast-frozen food products. In 1929 the company was bought by the Postum Company (later the General Foods Corp.) for \$22 million. By 1949, Birdseye had perfected the anhydrous freezing process, reducing the time needed for the operation from 18 hr to 11/2 hr. A prolific inventor, he held more than 200 patents. Clarence Birdseye was an active member of the Rotary Club of Gloucester, Massachussetts, USA

Angélique Kidjo's new album "Eve" debuted at No. 1 on Billboard's World Music Charts when it came out in January, now she has a video ready to accompany it. Kidjo today premieres "Eva" on Speakeasy.

The Benin native produced the video in conjunction with Rotary International as part of the organization's fight against polio in the developing world.

The clip alternates between shots of French-Nigerian musician Aṣa, who sings on the track, Kidjo and a little girl in a junk shop, as facts about polio pop up on the screen. The "End Polio Now" campaign is a cause that's close to Kidjo's heart, she said.

"I am alive because I was vaccinated as a child in Benin," she said. "I had school friends whose parents didn't believe in vaccination or understand that it was provided for free, and some of them ended up with polio! There is no excuse for any child to suffer from polio or any other preventable disease."


