





The Rotary Foundation partially subsidizes International Conferences to examine the role civil society can play in the achievement of peace. A 1997 Rotary Peace forum in Ushuaia, Tierra del Fuego, Argentina encouraged the continued status of Antarctica as a continent for all people, stressing the importance of peaceful, non-political international collaboration in Antarctica. No military presence is allowed in Antarctica, and access to the continent is reserved primarily for scientific purposes. About 35,000 tourists visit Antarctica annually.

Visitors embark and disembark for Antarctica from Ushuaia, the southernmost city in the world. One of the first things visitors to Ushuaia see upon entering/exiting the port is a Rotary peace park, featuring blessing about peace in 27 different languages.





In Alice Springs there is a place called 'The Purple House' and this is no ordinary house. 'The Purple House' is a dialysis treatment centre for Aboriginal patients with kidney disease and renal failure, providing dialysis in the most remote parts of Central and Northern Australia..

Remote Indigenous people in Central Australia are 15 to 30 times more likely to suffer from kidney disease caused by a wide variety of factors. Families must move off their country and come to Alice Springs for dialysis treatment.

Consequently, communities are left without elder leadership, families are broken and culture is weakened. Patients suffer from isolation and depression, restricted by a dialysis machine for their foreseeable future. Our aim is to improve the lives of people who have kidney disease by providing dialysis services and health education out in remote communities so that our families and culture can remain strong. Western Desert Dialysis provides haemodialysis in 9 locations and via their mobile unit "The Purple Truck".



District Governor John Lane's presentation was very informative; sharing some of the traditions and requirements of his role as D.G.. He even wore his collar which symbolises the authoritative role of office which covers 66 clubs, 4 Community Corps groups and 4 Rotaract Clubs.. all of which he is required to visit.. a very busy D.G. indeed! He also wore his Rotary Theme tie.. the design represents wattle and gum leaves (Aussie R.I. President influence).. He also talked about his rather adventurous trip to Papua New-Guinea during an election time.. How brave! John also was proud that he was able to celebrate 110 years of Rotary in Port Moresby as he was present for their 3,000th club meeting in attendance with the Governor General of Papua New Guinea and the Prime Minister's wife..


The R.C. of Kippa Ring-North Lakes has been successful in obtaining our \$35,000 grant from the Gambling Community Benefit Fund for construction of a shade seating structure at Woody Point Special School. The \$35,000 will be deposited into the Club's Community Service account within a fortnight.

The total project cost was quoted at \$40,337. The Club's contribution will be \$5,337 (\$40,337 - \$35,000).

The Woody Point Special School Parents and Citizens (P&C) Association has agreed to contribute 50% of the balance (\$5,337). The Rotary Club of Kippa Ring-North Lakes are committed to contributing the remaining 50% of the balance.

Woody Point Special School will engage the contractor Shade'n Net to commence construction at a suitable time. The project has to be completed and acquitted within 12 months from the time approval for the grant has been received.

Another great job by Rotarian Bernard van den Bergen in sourcing and preparing the Grant application! Well Done Bernard!

Stories of service from around the world

Opening doors in Cuba

Along with 40 friends and supporters of the
H2OpenDoors project, I took part in an eight-day
exploratory expedition to Cuba on 8 April.



Members of six Rotary clubs in District 5150 and their friends and family joined The Bay Area Cuba Community Alliance, starting on the far eastern side of the island for a visit and site survey at a small village in Granma province. Each person presented a suitcase of donations to the Town Delegate in an emotional ceremony.

Baseball equipment, animal husbandry tools, school supplies, and children's clothing were among the gifts for over 550 residents. The town had been home to one of the best community baseball teams in Cuba, but they have been unable to play for over two years for lack of equipment. After a great ball

game, the town elders hosted us for a lunch feast.

H2OpenDoors will return in December to install a SunSpring water purification plant to provide safe drinking water for the entire community, and an additional system in a similar community near Havana.

Following the visit to the rural colonies, our group hosted a cocktail gala at Havana's iconic Hotel Nacional for Cuban entrepreneurs to start a dialogue about Rotary and the recent visit by U.S. President Barak Obama's administration, and to build new friendships. The 120 participants broke out into four focus groups for lively discussions about the arts, education, water and infrastructure, and businesses.

Another 40 people will be able to join H2OpenDoors between 8-17 December for a similar schedule, including a day at the Havana International Jazz Festival. For more information go to www.H2OpenDoors.org or contact me at jon@H2OpenDoors.org

Did your Club invite those people in your community that you have done amazing projects for to your Club meeting?


Did your Club invite families of the students who you have supported in Youth Projects to your Club?
