He will be an asset to our Club.. Welcome, Col! Cheers GG



People fitted with these hands can go to school and learn to write, or to work at almost every trade, and work around the house.


Each hand costs \$400.00. Our club donated \$4,000.00, for one batch of hands. Thirty hands were assembled on 14 November.


