





P.S. Sure is hot down here!













Trees that spread peace

On 12 June, during the Rotary International Convention in Atlanta, we planted a Ginkgo nursery tree at The Carter Center, founded by former U.S. President Jimmy Carter, a recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize. The tree is a descendant of one that survived the atomic bomb in Hiroshima.

When I saw this young tree for the first time, I was blown away by its vigour and beauty. The sapling was cultivated from its mother tree by Green Legacy Hiroshima Initiative led by UNITAR Hiroshima, and cared for by Steaven Leeper and Elizabeth Baldwin for nearly six years before they brought it to Atlanta for the ceremony. The day of the planting included heavy rain, so the ceremony was

held inside. Then Rotary President John F. Germ, Past President Sakuji Tanaka, and the CEO of the Carter Center attended. A certificate was presented to Past District Governor Jiro Kawatsuma from Hiroshima. Visitors can now see the tree in a beautiful garden at the Center.

A few days prior to the ceremony, during the Presidential Peace Conference, our group presented a breakout session called "A Hopeful Future with Green Legacy in the Nuclear Age." Guest speakers included Tanaka and Ira Helfand, co-president of the International Physicians for the Prevention of Nuclear War, a Nobel Peace Prize Laureate. During the session, Kawatsuma also shared his personal account of the atomic bomb in Hiroshima. His

As a team leader from Japan, I presented about the partnership between the Rotary Club of Tokyo Yoneyama Yuai and UNITAR Hiroshima and its Green Legacy Hiroshima Initiative. It was moving for me to see the way the audience eagerly received the information, taking photos of the slides and recording speeches.

More and more Rotarians are joining our initiative. In 2016, a sapling taken from a tree that survived the atomic bomb in Hiroshima was planted at Storrier Stearns Japanese Garden, Pasadena, California, USA. Our goal is not only to plant trees but also seeds of peace in people's minds around the world. It is most important to tell our stories through these trees, so that people understand the importance of peace and nurture the trees as a symbol of life and hope.

I encourage you to visit one of these trees if you are in their area and reflect upon their message of peace.







OUR DISTRICT GOVERNOR.. WHO IS HE?













John was born in England and moved to Australia in 1965.

A Queensland Registered Builder (previously Gold Card) since 1980, most of his working life has been spent, in the construction industry, responsible for all of the management and financial aspects for a number of major builders.

In 1973 he established a North Queensland office for a level two major builder which he successfully ran for six years. Returning to Brisbane he was the Commercial Manager for another builder responsible for all marketing, procurement and commercial matters in addition to acting as the company's nominee to the Queensland Building and Construction Authority and representative to the Property Council.

Following their withdrawal from the Queensland Market in 2007, John commenced business as a consultant providing commercial advice and assistance to contractors and subcontractors. Invited to join Rotary at Port of Townsville Club in 1976 (their second youngest member at the time) he was a member until the family returned to Brisbane in 1979.

Due to family and work commitments he did not rejoin Rotary until 1994 when he became a member of RC Ashgrove - The Gap (his current Club), filling most roles including President in 1999/2000. Being very active at District level his roles have included Club Service Chair in 2000/01, Rotaract Chair 2001/04, Assistant Governor North-West Brisbane 2006/09, Membership Chair 2010/13 and Rotary Australia World Community Service Chair 2014/16.

A long time supporter of The Rotary Foundation John received Paul Harris recognition from Ashgrove-The Gap in 2003 and again in 2006. He is also a Charter Member of the District 9600 Paul Harris Society and a Major Donor.

John has three children Angela, Steven and Michael and four grandchildren Edward (Ned), Greta, Douglas and Georgina. Angela has a Master's In Education, teaches at St Paul's Bald Hills and is an avid triathlete. Steven is a Haematologist and Pathologist, working at Queensland Institute of Medical Research Berghoffer, researching Acute Myeloid Leukaemia, whilst also acting as a consultant in the Oncology Department at the Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital. Michael is a Medical Registrar currently undertaking specialist training in Allergies.

John lost his first wife, Beryl, to Cancer in 2009, after being married for 40 years. But in 2012 at the Bangkok Convention John met Helene 'Bo' Morse, a Rotarian from Northern California (San Francisco) they became engaged in 2013 and were married in August 2015.

THE DISTRICT GOVERNOR:

ROLE: To support the achievement of Rotary international goals through the effective leadership and management of Rotary District 9600. Administration of clubs in a Rotary District is under the direct supervision of the District governor.

DUTIES: The Governor is the officer of Rotary International in the District, functioning under the general control and supervision of the Rotary International Board. The Governor is charged with the duty of furthering the Object of Rotary by providing leadership and supervision of clubs within the District.

Rotary Foundation named World's Outstanding Foundation award for 2016!

The Association of Fundraising Professionals recognized The Rotary Foundation with its annual Award for Outstanding Foundation at its 2017 conference in San Francisco.

The award honours organizations that show philanthropic commitment and leadership through financial support, innovation, encouragement of others, and involvement in public affairs. Some of the boldest names in American giving — Kellogg, Komen, and MacArthur, among others —are past honourees.

Rotary Foundation Trustee Chair-elect Paul Netzel accepts the Award for Outstanding Foundation, on Rotary's behalf, at the Association of Fundraising Professionals 2017 conference. The announcement came on 15 November, known to industry professionals since the 1980s as National Philanthropy Day. The award was presented 2 May at the AFP's annual conference.

Rotary Foundation Trustee Chair-elect Paul Netzel accepted the award on Rotary's behalf, and Eric Schmelling, Rotary's chief philanthropy officer, also attended the conference. The event drew more than 3,400 senior-level fundraising professionals from 33 countries.

"In our Centennial year, we are deeply honoured to receive this recognition from the Association of Fundraising Professionals," said Netzel.

AFP's committee of judges cited Rotary's comprehensive campaign to eradicate polio as a major driver of the selection. "With the generous support of our members and partners, we've taken on some of the toughest humanitarian challenges in the world, none more so than the devastating disease of polio," said Netzel. "We will defeat polio, and it will be a landmark achievement for global public health."


