Born in Bologna, Italy, in 1874, *Guglielmo Marconi* was a Nobel Prizewinning physicist and inventor credited with the groundbreaking work necessary for all future radio technology. Through his experiments in wireless telegraphy, Marconi developed the first effective system of radio communication. In 1899, he founded the Marconi Telegraph

Company. In 1901, he successfully sent wireless signals across the Atlantic Ocean, disproving the dominant belief of the Earth's curvature affecting transmission. Marconi shared with Karl Braun the 1909 Nobel Prize in Physics. He died in Rome in 1937.. *Guglielmo Marconi was an active member of the Rotary Club of Bologna, Italy.*



ALSO... The 2014 Sydney Rotary Convention is set to be the largest indoor convention ever to be held in New South Wales, with more than 20,000 Rotarians, family and friends to gather in Sydney for this huge event.

AND... That a project of Rotary Club of Sydney – VISION BEYOND AUS (VBA) has already restored sight to over 6,000 people since 2011; and aims to restore the sight of another 100,000 of the worlds most disadvantaged people. Working predominantly with local surgeons and medical practitioners, VBA supports free eye surgery at 7 clinics in Nepal, Myanmar and Cambodia.

While Volunteers are required to fund their own costs of travel and living expenses, in some instances, Rotary Clubs or other organisations may provide some assistance. Volunteers must be able to cope with challenging working and living conditions whilst on site. A good sense of humour is a bonus. Most teams usually spend 2 weeks working at a site with the local people and then either return home directly or spend a few days sightseeing.

Project Volunteers have worked with local people and taught them basic skills whilst helping them build schools, hospitals, health clinics and other essential works.

Without assistance given by Volunteer Team members, many areas would not have the present day facilities required to alleviate problems associated with Health, Hunger and Humanity.

I am also pleased to report that Rotary received extensive media coverage throughout 2013, with more than 626 news organizations in 35 countries featuring our humanitarian efforts. Of those, 58 stories appeared in top tier international news organizations, including nine out of the 10 most influential ranked by Forbes, including the Associated Press, The New York Times, BBC, Agence France Presse, The Washington Postand the Wall Street Journal.

Rotary's role in the fight to end polio was highlighted in top-level, global media at unprecedented levels last year. And Rotary's partnership with its celebrity ambassadors for polio eradication helped raise our digital visibility to new audiences via posts onendpolio.org and celebrity social media channels.

Hurricane – Utah U.S.A... Crowds packed the Hurricane Community Center for the 29th annual Hurricane Rotary Easter Car Show on Saturday. This year's show had approximately 200 entries. Among the unique vehicles on display were a 1923 Ford Model T, a motorcycle with a custom airbrushed design paying tribute to those lost in 9/11 and Turbinator II, the world's fastest wheel-driven car.

Chairman Jeff Borden said that between 800 and 1,200 people were expected to attend.
