Gordon Rackley - Head of Service and Activities @ Grace Lutheran College together with Laurel; were our Guest Speakers last Wednesday night.

They gave us a presentation about their International Service project called "Watoto"

Watoto means "The Children". Watoto is a holistic child care ministry birthed out of a local church in Kampala, Uganda. It was initiated as a response to the growing number of orphans and vulnerable children in Uganda. The goal of Watoto is to raise the next generation of Ugandan leaders by pursuing excellence in academic and practical skills, integrity in conduct and moral values, so that each child becomes a responsible and productive citizen. Watoto is restoring hope and dignity to vulnerable women and war-affected children by providing quality education, marketable vocational skills, trauma rehabilitation, life skills training and discipleship.

Watoto is currently caring for over 2000 parentless children by providing physical, emotional, educational and spiritual care.

A Team from Grace journeyed to Watoto last June/July and assisted in building an orphanage, amongst other projects; whilst also visiting other facilities and experiencing African culture on what would be the trip of a life time. It was at times a confronting, fun, challenging, yet highly rewarding encounter.



Australian and New Zealand Districts include Nauru, Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands, Timor Leste, American Samoa, Cook Islands, Fiji, Kiribati, New Caledonia, Norfolk Island, Samoa, Tonga and Vanuatu, where there are 776 Rotarians in 41 clubs. February 23 in the history of Rotary

Paul Harris started Rotary as a means of bringing business minds together. This had been inspired by a simple walk around the Chicago neighborhood with a business colleague, who introduced him to various tradesmen en route. It reminded Harris of the friendly spirit he had felt in his home town in Vermont as a youngster. Paul Harris decided that he would create a community of business people, regardless of religion or political belief.

Paul Harris together with colleagues, Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele and Hiram Shorey formed the Rotary Club of Chicago. The first meeting was held on February 23, 1905. Meetings were held each week at members" offices, in "rotation", hence the name Rotary. The next club was formed in San Francisco, closely followed by Oakland, Seattle and Los Angeles. By the early 1920s, hundreds of clubs were up and running.

As Rotary developed and became a feature of landscape across the world, it expanded its mission. Officially Rotary moved away from serving club members" professional and social interests, to pooling efforts and




Now, there are over 34,000 Rotary Clubs worldwide, where members give their time and their talents to undertaking worthwhile projects, which save lives and shape the future.

Harland Sanders was born in 1890 in the little town of Henryville in southern Indiana. The "Colonel" was given to him in 1935 as an honorary title by the governor of Kentucky in recognition of his accomplishments, and ever afterward everyone called him "The Colonel".

Sanders had been an active Rotarian since 1919 when he became a founder member of the Rotary Club of Jeffersonville, Indiana, at the age of 29. After that he joined the Rotary Club of Corbin and then the Rotary Club of Shelbyville, and was an active member until 1980 when the door closed on his life of many achievements.

Two Major Swimming Events

1. Continuous distance relay (team of 10 max) Distance relay will be swum in 4 x 60min sessions. 2 to 4 swimmers from each team in the pool at any one time. \$200 per team, plus \$20 per swimmer, signage opportunities available (Corporate sponsorship is tax deductible). Get sponsorship or be sponsored by a local business. Keep track of Most Distance, Oldest Average Age, Youngest Average Age, Handicap, Total Distance Swum x Average Age of Team Members.

10.00-11.00 First continuous relay swim session
11.30-12.30 Second continuous relay swim session
1.00-2.00 Third continuous relay swim session
2.30-3.30 Final continuous relay swim session

2. Handicap team sprint relay (team of 4) Handicap relay - swim for a time, get a handicap and then swim again - fastest teams then go to semi-finals and finals. NB If you swim more than 10 secs faster than your first swim, you get DQ'd. \$50 entry per team or get your team sponsored.

11.00-11.30 Heats of Handicap relays
12.30-1.00 Repechage Handicap relay heats
2.00-2.30 Handicap relay elimination semi-finals
3.30-4.00 Handicap relay finals
