



The Rotary Club of St John, New Brunswick was formed in 1914 and was the 126th club established in the world. At their first meeting there were only 18 members present.

In 1915 they held their first annual meeting with 59 members present – their average attendance for the year was 63% . In 1921 the Club raised \$3,000 for the Boy Scouts, \$11,000 for the Salvation Army and \$7,000 for war relief for European children. In 1955 the Boys and Girls Club commemorated the 50th anniversary of Rotary International at a cost of \$100,000. In 1965 a Rotary Senior Citizens Housing Complex was constructed consisting of 20 apartments at a cost of \$159,000. Between 1975-1986 Rotarian Dunc

Wathen built up their Rotary District from 21 to 50 clubs, which became a world record. In 1976 Rotary helped to raise \$1,000,000 to rebuild the Boys and Girls Club after a disastrous fire and in 1989 Brunswick Drive was renamed Paul Harris Street as this accommodated the entrance to the Boys and Girls Club. In 1989 the Club pledged \$50,000 to the Provincial Cardiac Care Unit. In 2000, the PROBUS club was formed and in 2003 the Club pledged \$21,000 to polio eradication. *The Club meets on Mondays at 12.15pm at the Howard Johnson Hotel.*Fellows and guests please be upstanding, and raise your glasses to toast the Rotary Club of St John, New Brunswick
















Got any old books gathering dust?

Scotts Zoint

Scotts Point lies between Margate and Woody Point, in the Redcliffe City district, along a coastal strip featuring one of Moreton Bay Shire's longest mainland stretches of sand beach. Margate and Scotts Point with their long expanses of clean white sand and sheltered waters are popular swimming spots for families with young children. Scotts Point is the start of a 1 kilometre long low rocky bluff and reef section that terminates at the southern Woody Point. Along the central northern section is a narrow 200 metre long high tide beach backed by a boulder seawall, walkway and vegetated bluffs, with rocks and reefs littering the intertidal zone. When the wind is up, Scotts Point at the southern end is perfect for windsurfing. This is one of the few locations close to Brisbane which is not majorly affected by tides. The quaint swimming pavilion at Scotts Point is an historical reference to a bygone era as are the many Norfolk Pine trees lining the esplanade that were planted by the first settlers in the area, more than 150 years ago.
