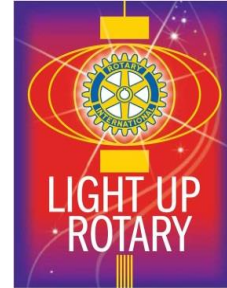

INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR DISASTER RISK REDUCTION 2014

Resilience is for life.

The objective of observing International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction is to sensitize the social and financial communities and organization on their important role in reducing disaster risk, and to increase awareness in the disaster and risk management community of the utility of existing financial tools and safety nets to mitigate the vulnerability of disaster-prone populations.

Global Handwashing Day - October 15, 2014 in the World



Global Handwashing Day (GHD) is a campaign to motivate and mobilize millions around the world to wash their hands with soap. The campaign is dedicated to raising awareness of handwashing with soap as a key approach to disease prevention. The campaign was initiated to reduce childhood mortality rates related respiratory and diarrheal diseases by introducing simple behavioural changes - hand washing with soap. This simple, accessible action can, according to research, reduce the rate of mortality from these diseases by almost 50 per cent.



ShelterBox Youth Exchange Challenge

Shelterbox Australia are excited to re-launch our ShelterBox YEP Challenge. This time around, the challenge has a uniquely Australian feel to it. Rotary Youth Exchange students are challenged to learn about ShelterBox and disaster relief and then put their new found knowledge to good use. By presenting to their host club, school or community about ShelterBox they are challenged to raise enough money to fund a box. Successful participants will receive a certificate of achievement, a special ShelterBox Australia YEP Challenge pin badge and t-shirt.

Recent SHELTERBOX deployments

Mexico - Hurricane

Hurricane Odile (a category 3 hurricane) made landfall on the Baja peninsula on 15/09/2014, damaging infrastructure and causing some flooding. Working with **Red Cross** and local **Rotary** contacts, SRT volunteers, Derek Locke and Yi Shun Lai (both US) have identified **500 families needing assistance** in the Los Cabos area and shelter repair kits will be provided in the near future.



Nepal - Flooding

Earlier this month, communities along the Nepal-China border were submerged by rising floodwater. It is now estimated that as many as 19 districts are currently underwater across the mountainous country. The Response Team is currently divided between Kathmandu (logistics) and Surkhet (overseeing distribution). Needs assessments in the Bardiya area are underway. The team is also looking into the feasibility of deploying shelter repair kits alongside conventional ShelterBoxes to help meet shelter needs. Distribution of the first shipment of 224 boxes began last weekend.



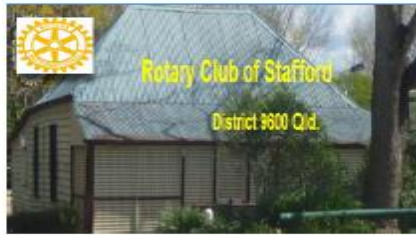
Iraq - Conflict

The rapid advance of militant fighters has thrown Iraq into crisis and has now led to overseas involvement in the form of aid interventions. ShelterBox has prepositioned stock in Iraq and will be working with **ACTED** to establish a camp to provide shelter for internally displaced people (IDP's). There are around 1,900 tents in Iraq Kurdistan, of which approximately 600 have recently been distributed. Deployment of the remaining tents is awaiting resolution of various practical issues such as land ownership.

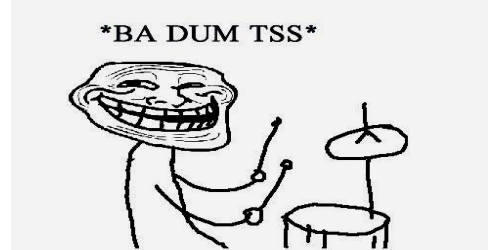
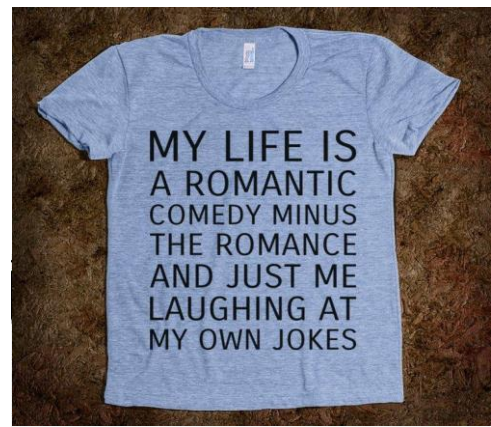

Young Rotarian building a brighter future

Sian White –

Sian White, has devoted much of her young life to human rights, social justice, reconciliation and the environment and she doesn't appear to be slowing down any time soon.

At 27, Sian White was awarded an OAM in the Australia Day 2014 Honours List for service to international relations, particularly through tuberculosis prevention programs in the Pacific. Sian has been an active member or volunteer with 27 organisations including extensive work with the indigenous people of WA, facilitating a range of activities and long-term community projects.



Sian became a Paul Harris Fellow at age 15, and also Young Australian of the Year for Community Service in the same year. Sian carried the Olympic Torch in 2000 and in 2004 was selected by the Rotary Club of Midland, WA, to go on a Rotary Youth Exchange to Norway for a year. Sian has also raised enough funding for over 300 "Wheelchairs for Kids" in need around the world.

At 21, Sian started a four-year project in India to build two hostels for blind, deaf and dumb children, contacting the Rotary clubs of Scarborough, WA, and Udaipur, India, for matching grants. A third project was equipping a vocational training centre with educational classes, workshops and retail outlets for disabled young people.

As a delegate for many leadership conferences and humanitarian causes, Sian has travelled to Cambodia, Korea, Hong Kong, Fiji and the USA. More recently she went to Mongolia and Nepal for research programs.

Sian worked in Papua New Guinea for four years as project manager for the National Tuberculosis Program and is now doing research at London University into evolutionary and social motivators of hygiene and sanitation behaviour in Asia and Africa.
