Rotarians assist with drought relief in Longreach



Standing firm: Longreach Rotary's Dave Phelps has been working in conjunction with coastal Rotary Clubs to ensure the western Queensland drought appeal sustains its momentum.

Rotary clubs around Australia have donated \$860,000 cash and in-kind for Queensland drought relief in the last two years and have set a target of \$1m before the end of the year. Rockhampton North Rotary Club project manager Ron Poulsen said it was understood that the drought wasn't over.

Over the past two years the club had given \$25,000 in credit card vouchers, which had been distributed to graziers in need around the Longreach, Winton and surrounding areas, and has now pledged to donate another \$10,000 to the Longreach and District Drought Assistance Project. "This has had a positive result across the whole community because rather than sending food or other products, the vouchers are used at local businesses in Longreach and other centres who are doing it very tough as well."


The Kenmore club ran a number of innovative programs including a youth driver awareness and a fortnightly "Eminent Speaker's Program", he said.

Shelterbox recent deployments



Sri Lanka - Floods/Landslides

Torrential rain over the Bay of Bengal in May caused heavy flooding and major landslides in Sri Lanka, displacing 1000's. ShelterBox has been working with Rotary and the local authorities to construct camps for displaced families. 328 ShelterBoxes are in the process of being distributed. Camps have been set up for those that have lost their homes, with water and sanitation provided by the Sri Lankan Disaster Management Agency.

Ecuador - Earthquake

Following a 7.8 magnitude earthquake in April in the Ecuadorian province of Esmeraldas, ShelterBox has been working with Rotary, local NGO, PROGAD and Habitat For Humanity to help affected families. 2600 Shelter Kits and Non-Food Items (Water Filters, Water Carriers, Solar Lights, Kitchen Sets, Mosquito Nets) were sent. The Response Team has now returned home, with a follow up visit planned later this month.

ROTARY HOSTS PANEL ON DRINKING WATER SAFETY IN CHICAGO

EVANSTON, Ill. (June 17, 2016) — As the number of [Chicago Public Schools testing positive](#) for elevated levels of toxic lead continues to rise in the wake of the Flint, Michigan water crisis, Rotary hosted a panel discussion Thursday about the safety of Chicago's water supply.

The event, moderated by WBEZ reporter, Monica Eng, featured industry experts including: [Dr. Lawrence Reynolds](#), Flint pediatrician and member of the Governor's Water Advisory Task Force; [Jamie Gaskin](#), CEO, United Way of Genesee County, Michigan; [Joel Brammeier](#), president & CEO, Alliance for the Great Lakes; [Dave Stoneback](#), director of the Evanston Public Works Agency; and Amy Krug, president, Rotary Club of Flint.



"Children are the most vulnerable members of our society and the effects of lead can have lingering effects," said Dr. Reynolds. "Some of the issues may not show up until later down the line, long after lead exposure."

Multiple Chicago Public Schools tested for lead have shown positive test results – many linking back to outdated fixtures in the schools.

"There is no federal law that says schools have to be tested for lead and in many schools it's an outdated fixture problem," said Gaskin. "Just replacing the lead service lines is not going to provide a solution. It's a complicated and dynamic problem."

Chicago, like most Midwestern and Eastern Seaboard cities, uses lead pipes to deliver water to thousands of its residents. An estimated 80 percent of Chicago households use lead service lines. In addition, Chicago installed lead pipes until 1986 – the year they were banned nationwide.

"We live in a place with 20 percent of the world's fresh surface water, said Brammeier. "If we can't get that water safely to people, we're falling down on the job."

ROTARY YOUTH PROGRAM OF ENRICHMENT (RYPEN)



What is RYPEN ?

The Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment was first developed in Australia in 1980. RYPEN is a weekend long leadership camp held yearly for 14-17 year olds and supported by district 9600 Rotary Clubs.

RYPEN aims to provide young people with the opportunity to develop their potential and self-esteem, provide experiences that will assist them to form their own values and moral standards, and to broaden their cultural, social and academic horizons. The program will push students to develop their leadership skills so that they can excel in their field.

The program this year will be held from the 12th-14th of August 2016 at Luther Heights Camp at Coolum.

Activities:

The program varies from year to year however students will be involved in:

Goal setting, Presentation skills, Problem solving and decision making

Self-esteem building, Outdoor activities and sports e.g. high ropes

Inspiring Guest Speakers ... Cost is \$250 per student
