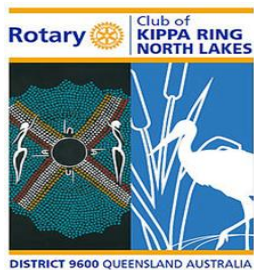

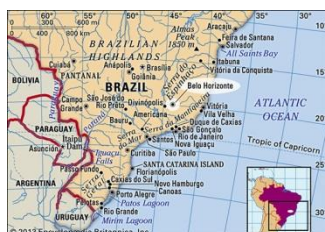

- The first women joined Rotary in 1987. Today, more than 200,000 women are members of Rotary International.
- The Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarships is the world's largest, privately funded scholarship program.
- Rotary became bilingual in 1916 when the first club was organized in a non-English- -speaking country--Havana, Cuba.
- The first head of state to address a Rotary convention was U.S. President (Rotarian) Warren G. Harding in 1923 at St. Louis.



Australia can fit inside Brazil



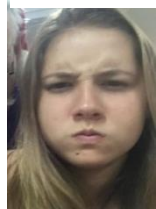

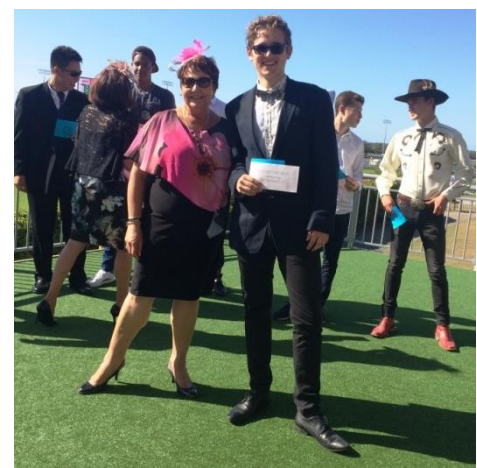

Hi, my name is Amalia and I'm a 17-year-old girl from Sweden, currently on exchange in Australia through Rotary.

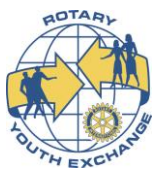
