

Our Rotary Club takes absolute pride in knowing that we have contributed to *making a difference* to the Hercules Road State School community by our involvement in their Chappy program.



ShelterBox Nominated For Nobel Peace Prize

We've had a lot of questions and enthusiasm about the news that ShelterBox has been nominated for this year's [Nobel Peace Prize](#). We are truly honoured to be able to confirm that this is true. We'll keep you updated with any further news – the winner is announced in October 2018.



Building Peace

Every minute, more families – just like yours – lose everything in the chaos of conflict. Their homes, their livelihoods, and even family members are brutally snatched away.

When missiles and mortars leave cities in ruins, when troops storm villages, when families fear for their lives – we believe that shelter can cut through the chaos.



Shelter is more than a roof. It is protection from the cold, the rain, the sun, dangerous animals, disease. It is the foundation for life, for family, for community. It's a space to feel safe, to have privacy, to heal and start the long road to recovery.

Right now, we're providing aid to families with houses left in tatters by bombs and fighting. We're helping families caught in some of the world's most extreme conflict zones, including the Syrian conflict and the Lake Chad Basin, and also in some of the world's largest refugee camps like Cox's Bazar in Bangladesh.

Our work keeps families and communities together, increasing feelings of stability and togetherness during a time of unprecedented global conflict and displacement. We can't give back what was lost, but we can provide the tools for families and communities to start their own recovery, promoting stability in the face of such huge trauma.

We can give tents, tarpaulins, ropes and nails and other vital tools to rebuild a home. Solar lights so children can see their parents in the dark night and communities can combat isolation at night. Blankets to keep warm; mosquito nets, water filters and containers to protect from disease; cooking pots to provide meals.

All vitally important when suddenly you have nothing and you need to rebuild your home and your place in the world.

The nomination is also an implicit recognition of the partnership between ShelterBox and Rotary International. Two great organisations combining their efforts to provide disaster aid wherever it may be required across our world. Last year Shelterbox helped 32,000 households, or 160,000 people, who had lost everything through conflict or natural disaster. Shelterbox responded to world events 24 times in the year and deployed aid to 20 different countries. Rotary groups around the world helped Shelterbox provide vulnerable people with emergency shelter and aid in almost all of the countries affected by natural disaster. In 2017, Shelterbox also surpassed the highest number of days ever deployed in one year. This includes 84 ShelterBox Response Team volunteers who deployed for a total of 1,530 days. That's an average volunteer deployment of 18 days each.

We can never underestimate the impact of the support of Rotary International, Rotary Clubs and individual Rotarian has to ShelterBox in achieving their goal of no family without shelter.

As individual organisations we can make a difference in the world; as a partnership we can do even more.

Our Club is also heavily supportive of the following Youth Service initiatives:

CHAMELEON YOUTH HOUSING REDCLIFFE.

Chameleon Youth Housing has operated on the Redcliffe Peninsula for over 25 years. They are primarily a youth accommodation and support service and cater for both male and female residents aged 16-17 year olds. In some circumstances they support young people under 16 years of age to ensure their immediate welfare and safety. Chameleon Youth Housing supports a large number of young people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. Our Club has supported both financially and labour-in-kind Chameleon House over many years.

INTERACT CLUB OF GRACE LUTHERAN COLLEGE

Our Club chartered and enthusiastically supports the Interact Club at the Grace Lutheran College in Rothwell. Last year celebrated 30 years continuous service. There are currently around 25 active Members. The Interact Club is an active partner with our Club with regards to fundraising for our major International project – Harvest Cambodia.. and regularly commit to the purchase of Shelterboxes.. Club Members **Mr. John Lloyd, Mr. Fred Stolz, Mr. Garry Gibson and Mr. Ashley Broad** have been regular attendees at their meetings over the years to nurture and encourage the Rotary values.

EARLYACT CLUB and CHAPLAINCY PROGRAM of Hercules Road State School

Our Club Members **Ashley Broad, Bernard van den Bergen and Laura van Zyl** were the prime instigators for chartering the EarlyAct club of Hercules Road State School .. and were also the prime movers to the initiation of a Chaplaincy Program at this school.. the results as can be seen elsewhere in this Bulletin.

Redcliffe Child Safety Service Centre Refurbishment

Our Club has refurbished the child-safe play facility at the premises of the Department of Communities, Child Safety and Disability in Redcliffe; by installing a soft-fall surface and some secure child-friendly fencing, together with some additional painting/decoration of the area. The completed task has enabled the attending children to be cared for in a bright and inviting environment.




WOODY POINT SPECIAL SCHOOL



Our Club enjoys a very long association with this school and have participated in many projects (over 25 years) to help improve the quality of the lives of their students. Most recently, we undertook to apply for a 'Gambling Community Benefit Fund Application' for \$20,000 to fund the installation of a shade structure and 'Softfall' surface to a play area within the Woody Point Special School grounds. We were successful with this application, and the works have been completed; with the kids (and staff) still absolutely delighted with the result!

Our Club has contributed over \$140,000 to the Woody Point Special School throughout our 40 year history.
