WEDNESDAY 9 APRIL 2014 –

Tony South



“Shot by a misdirected bullet at age 9 and confined to a wheelchair in a society that didn't understand disabilities, I was forced to decide whether to be handicapped or handicapable. How much easier life was for others had no value to me. I came to realize that the only thing that we are given in life is opportunity. Either I had to be motivated to be successful .. or... be prepared to just accept my situation. I decided to do something about it and got into archery in a big way.”

Tony South is a highly motivated man who lives his life to the fullest! A paraplegic since he was accidentally shot at the age of nine, he has represented Australia in archery at four Olympic and Commonwealth Games, holding two World Paraplegic Records as the World Paraplegic Archery Champion (1968-1972), was awarded Disabled Achiever of the Year, Queensland, in 1986, the Order of Australia Award (OAM) for service to the community in 1992 and the Australian Medal (AM) in 2008 for services to injury prevention. He says that spinal injury is one of the most expensive traumatising disabilities that any Australian can incur and after 61 years as a "wheelie" he describes himself as being "handicapable", capable of achieving anything he puts his mind to.

Funds raised from the 2014 Time4Kids initiative will be used to support Redcliffe PCYC's Suspension Outcomes Program (SOS). This program supports local high schools & the community by providing a venue for suspended students to continue receiving educational support and supervision during their period of suspension. The SOS Project provides suspended students the opportunity to:

- attend a safe, supervised venue;
- obtain educational support and guidance – numeracy / literacy activities, 1 on 1 counselling, small group counselling activities;
- participate in a variety of experiential / activity based trainings – sporting activities, gym work, group and personal challenges;
- opportunity to modify attitudes and behaviours, understanding there are consequences to certain actions and behaviours; and
- will reduce the opportunity for suspended students to enter into antisocial behaviour or commit offences.
