

WORLD: Rotarians amongst the 1st to help Ecuador &



What a great night we all had last week with the Anzac Trivia. Yes not just war questions, we all found out how much we all knew about our younger brothers across the Tasman—New Zealand. I think we all learnt something new that night! So to keep you all in suspense.... (that's oops for not having the answers to the last round) Here they are now:

GENERAL:

- 1. Phar Lap the racehorse was born in New Zealand and trained in Australia. He was a hero on both sides of the Tasman after he died, Phar Lap's body was distributed between the two countries. Which parts are where?
 - A: Hide and heart in Australia, skeleton in New Zealand
- 2. The first sheep shearers in New Zealand came from Australia. What kind of sheep farming had already been established in Australia before beginning in New Zealand? A:: Merino
- 3. The popular Down Under food spread 'Vegemite' is a black goopy paste harvested from the Vegemite tree. This tree is native to which country?
 - A: Neither country— Vegemite is actually a yeast extract—made from the goop at the bottom of a beer brewer's val. Very tasty to the dinkum downunder-it (particularly on toast), it is an 'acquired taste' to the overseas visitor. It was immortalised in the 1982 mega-hit by the group Men at Work called 'Down Under' oldies will recall the lyrics 'I said do you speak-a my language, he just smiled and gave me a Vegemite sandwich".
- 4. The Parma Wallaby was thought to be extinct in Australia by the end of the 19th Century. However, in 1965 a remnant population was found Down Under where?
 - A: Kawau Island, New Zealand Kawau Island was once owned by the influential NA Leader George Grey, who kept a zoo on this fairly substantial island. Workers contracted in 1965 to exterminate some 'tammar wallaby' pests on this island, were astonished to discover 'extinct' Parma Wallabies thriving. They have since also been discovered back in their homeland, near Gasford, NSW, Australia.
- 5. New Zealand is often called the 'Shaky Isles', owing to the frequency of earthquakes it experiences. Australia - 'the Great Southern Land' is by comparison a stable continental landmass. The deadliest quake Down Under in the last 50 years occurred in which city, claiming 13 lives and injuring 162?
 - A: Newcastle, Australia A magnitude of 5.6 earthquake hit Newcastle, the sixth largest city in Australia, on Thursday 28 December 1989. In addition to the numerous casualties, the damage bill was estimated at around A\$4 billion dollars


