












The Rotary Club of Chicago

The Rotary movement began right here in Chicago, in 1905, when a small group of businessmen formed a charitable organization dedicated to serving their community and fostering fellowship among members of the professional community. Paul Harris, Silvester Schiele, Gustavus Loehr and Hiram Shorey organized their first meetings in each others' offices, switching off each meeting at a different office location. Thus, the "Rotary" Club was born, only a few blocks from the Rotary Club of Chicago's current meeting place.

Today, the Rotary Club of Chicago boasts over 200 members who continue to meet on a weekly basis, a dedicated Foundation (the ROTARY/One Foundation, Inc.), a vibrant calendar of guest speakers, and strong participation in service projects both in Chicago and across the world, the Rotary Club of Chicago is carrying forward the traditions and values that were first founded here over 110 years ago. The Club sponsors two Rotaract Clubs: The Rotaract Club of Chicago and the Rotaract Club of the University of Chicago.

Rotary celebrates its 110th birthday

February18, 2015

The service organisation Rotary International is celebrating its founding 110 years ago with a special event callsign VI 110 ROTARY that will be heard from Australia for three months.

Rotary's signature initiative has been to rid the world of Polio. That aim has almost been reached thanks to Rotary being joined by governments, the World Health Organisation and prominent community people such as Bill Gates. Rotarians worldwide will use special events to publicise the Polio initiative to help speed the eradication program.

It will also mark the first Rotary Club meeting that saw a group of local professionals meet for the first time in Chicago Illinois in February 1905.

Rotarians of Amateur Radio or ROAR will launch the callsign at the Wyong Field Day at Gosford, New South Wales, on Sunday the 22nd of February, and using hopefully a brand new software defined radio.

ROAR Vice President for Australia, New Zealand and Oceania, Phil Byrne VK2MCB says that VI 110 ROTARY will then be on 7118, 14295.2 and 21295 kHz from various locations around Australia. The international fellowship of ROAR and Amateur Radio is long standing. Similar events may also be planned in other countries.





Half Yearly Report

On the 5th May 2014 the World Health Organisation has declared the international spread of wild polio virus an international public health emergency and issued temporary recommendations to reduce the international health regulations to reduce the international spread of wild polio virus. This reflected the dramatic increase in the number of cases of polio in the first quarter of 2014. The virus had been jumping from country to country — Pakistan to Afghanistan, Syria to Iraq, and Cameroon to Equatorial Guinea — and the WHO recommended that travellers from these countries should carry an internationally recognised document certifying that they have been vaccinated.

The declaration of the international public health emergency saw the application of additional resources to the vaccination programs in these areas.

In 2013 Syria (which had been polio free for 14 years) reported 37 cases of paralytic polio . The wild polio virus had been imported from Pakistan and the displacement of some 6 million people meant that virus could potentially spread to surrounding countries Rotary provided \$43.6 million to fund a program to vaccination of 22 million children in Syria and surrounding countries and halt the spread of polio in this region . Following this mass vaccination program there was only one reported case of paralytic polio in Syria 2014 (on 24th January 2014).

In 2012 Nigeria recorded 122 cases of paralytic polio. Following mass vaccination programs, this reduced to 53 cases in 2013 and 6 cases in 2014. It is now over 6 months since the last recorded case of paralytic polio in Nigeria. The bans on vaccination in parts of Pakistan and the targeting of vaccination workers by Islamic militants (Some 64 people including health workers and police have been killed in attacks since December 2012) has resulted in a spike in cases of polio from 93 cases in 2013 to 305 cases in 2014 (85

% of all new Wild Polio 1 cases reported in 2014).

In 2013 -2014 District 9600 raised \$65,925 for Polio Plus. This was a great effort.

These funds attracted a 2 for 1 subsidy from the Gates Foundation providing over \$197,000 towards the fight to End Polio Now.

It is important that as Rotarians we continuing our fundraising efforts and our advocacy to End Polio Now. Rotary has 1.2 million voices and is make a real difference. We must continue to use our influence to highlight the continuing need to vaccinate our children and grandchildren provide advocacy and financial support to the End Polio Now Campaign.
