Last meeting, our Guest speaker was Mrs. **Angela Armstrong** whilst manning our Christmas Trailer raffle at Coles in Redcliffe; Angela approached us, bought a raffle ticket and enquired as to whether Rotary was able to assist her. She explained that her 13 y.o. daughter Leah has a genetic defect, called Phelan–McDermid Syndrome (PMS). Which is very rare – approx. 1,300 cases are known - only around 60 in Australia. It has been a struggle to get the expertise needed in Australia to support Leah's mental health and neurological issues. Angela's eldest daughter is part of the Grace community, and a chance meeting with Ashley Broad to buy a raffle ticket has led to our Club allocating one of our Bunnings BBQ dates to Angela for Leah's cause.



The funds raised from the proceeds of this BBQ will assist Angela and Leah attend a conference in Orlando, Florida, USA in July, 2016; to assist families learn new and different ways to embrace PMS, contribute to scientific research regarding the impact of the syndrome on adolescence and adults and the opportunity to meet the top specialists for P.M.S. They will learn how to give Leah the best quality of life and allow her the opportunity of the best future possible! Angela can also assist with other people affected by this disease with the new knowledge she will acquire via this conference.

It's Rotary Fellowships Month

Introduction to Rotary Fellowships

Rotary Fellowships are international, independently organized groups of Rotarians, Rotarian spouses, and Rotaractors who share a common vocation or recreational interest. Rotary Fellowships give their members the opportunity to have fun, make new friends around the world, and enhance their experience in Rotary.

Rotary Fellowships began informally in 1928 when Rotarians with a shared interest in the international language Esperanto joined together. In 1947, a group of Rotarian boating enthusiasts began flying the Rotary flag from their crafts, calling themselves the International Yachting Fellowship of Rotarians — which now holds the distinction of being the oldest continuing fellowship. The scope of fellowships has changed significantly over the years, but their purpose remains the same: to unite Rotarians in friendship and provide opportunities to enjoy favorite recreational or professional activities.

Many fellowships also use their special interests to serve others. For example, the Fellowship of Canoeing Rotarians has organized cleanups of polluted rivers; members of the International Computer Users Fellowship of Rotarians conduct training sessions for Rotarians and others in their community; and members of the International Fellowship of Rotarian Scuba Divers join local Rotary clubs to undertake service projects on each of their diving trips.

Rotary International has established specific policies for forming a Rotary Fellowship. The RI Board of Directors evaluates each prospective group before deciding whether to formally recognize it. However, each fellowship operates independently of RI, with its own rules, dues requirements, and administrative structure. Membership is open to all Rotarians, Rotarian spouses, and Rotaractors.


KIPPA'S RIB-TICKLER OF THE WEEK!


