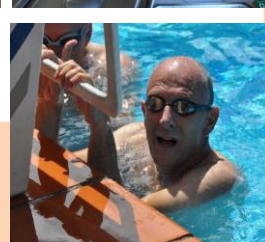

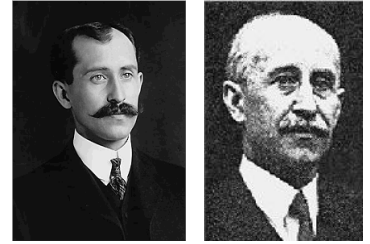

DID YOU
KNOW ?

Orville Wright was born August 19, 1871 in Dayton, Ohio. Along with his brother Wilbur, he invented and built the first successful controllable airplane. Even as children, mechanics fascinated the brothers. After reading about the death of pioneer glider pilot Otto Lilienthal in 1896, they became interested in flying. They began serious reading on the subject in 1899, and soon obtained all the scientific knowledge of aeronautics then available. On December 17, 1903 near Kitty Hawk, North Carolina,



they made the world's first flight in a powered, heavier-than-air machine. With Orville at the controls, the plane flew 120 feet (37 meters) in 12 seconds. The Wrights believed that airplanes would eventually be used to transport passengers and mail. When the Wrights first offered their machine to the U.S. government, they were not taken seriously, but by 1908 they closed a contract with the U.S.

Department of War for the first military airplane. Wilbur passed away in 1912, just as the airplane was beginning to make great advances. Orville worked on alone and in 1913 won the Collier Trophy for a device to automatically balance airplanes. In 1915 he sold his interest in the Wright Company, and continued work on the development of aviation in his own shop. In 1929, he received the first Daniel Guggenheim Medal for his and Wilbur's contributions to the advancement of aeronautics. He died on January 30, 1948. Orville was elected to the Hall of Fame for Great Americans in New York City in 1965. **Orville Wright was an active member of the Rotary Club of Dayton, Ohio, U.S.A.**

ROTARY CALENDAR – MARCH IS



MONTH

This month (March) is declared LITERACY MONTH by Rotary International to draw attention to the significant impact Literacy (education) and its lack of same could have on a project. Further to expand upon the importance of improving reading skills and education; and to compound the effect of the assistance Rotarians are delivering around the world through their many outreach projects and activities; recent publications suggest that 15% of the world's population lack basic literacy skills. Of the world's children, 113 million do not go to school and 500 million women are uneducated. Two thirds of the world's population cannot read. To make this even worse; in the developed world, 17% of adults are functionally illiterate; that is to say... they cannot read well enough to function effectively in our complex post-modern society. It has been noted that children of mothers with primary education are 20% more likely to survive. The ability to read and write has a miraculous impact on a person's self image!

When Rotarians in District 4420 (part of São Paulo, Brazil) learned that literacy rates had fallen to 50 percent in 2011 from 55 percent in 2007, they decided to take action. With the help of a Rotary Foundation District Grant, they began Project READ (Reading and Education Centre) to provide reading rooms for children in poor communities. The project equips each centre with books and toys that encourage reading among children aged 5-12. A local monitor supervises each reading room and tutors students. "We believe that investing in reading for children will bring a big change in their lives as well as their families'," says Marcos Franco, past governor of District 4420 and president of the board of Project READ. "Many clubs in our district have adult literacy and youth education projects," he adds. "(Literacy) is a major concern in our district." To address the literacy decline, 12 clubs collaborated to build 13 reading rooms, 6 of which received district grant funding. The rooms are located in hospitals, community centers, and other public facilities. "Our experience with the use of district grants shows that they provide a great opportunity to leverage specific and necessary projects for the local community with much agility and a fantastic return, strengthening Rotary's image and changing lives,"

RC Kippa-ring are extremely proud and privileged to contribute to the improvement of literacy levels with our continued involvement with our major international project – the Harvest Cambodia/Stepping Stones program. We are most definitely engaging in Literacy Month!

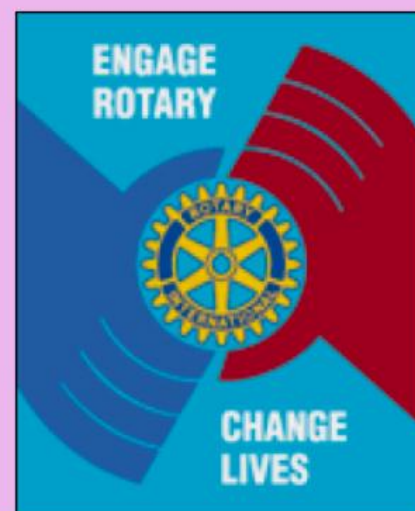

Subject: District Conference - Australia Cervical Cancer Foundation (ACCF) Display

Fellow Rotarians visiting our District Conference at Maroochydore at the end of the month, I would like to draw your attention to the display by Australia Cervical Cancer Foundation (ACCF)

During my preparation for District Governor next year, I identified a need to assist women in PNG and Solomon Islands where cervical cancer is the greatest cause of death and the situation is not being addressed. Mary and I commenced dialogue with ACCF and we have had ongoing meetings over several months. We now propose to proceed with an application to the Rotary Foundation for a global grant to fund a three year trial in Port Moresby to address this problem. With the guiding support of ACCF, we will involve Rotarians in a program to provide community awareness, education, promotion, Treatment and vaccination in Port Moresby only at this stage.

The Rotary Club of Boroko has already pledged \$100000 towards this project and I will be seeking the support of other clubs in our district to assist. The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation assists with subsidising vaccine.

I will be attending the display between plenary sessions to assist explaining this project and will be supported by Rotarians from our Island Clubs who will be visiting for our International Pets Seminar.

Any support from our clubs would be donated directly to the Rotary Foundation where full PHF recognition would be credited to the donor club but this project would be nominated when submitting the donation. Clubs who may be interested in being part of the project let me know so that your club and pledged donation can be on the global grant application. Money is only donated after the Global Grant is approved.

It would be wonderful if we could attract the support of all of our clubs to assist with this project.
